





JOINT INITIATIVE AGAINST RADICALIZATION AND VIOLENT EXTREMISM

MAIN CONCEPT OF THE PROJECT

The project aims to promote the prevention of violent extremism and radicalization in the communities of Tbilisi, Shida Kartli, Adjara and Guria regions - through cooperation between two major educational institutions, a school and a university.

TARGET AUDIENCES

- 50 civic education teachers
- About 2000 pupils
- 50 students

MAIN ACTIVITIES OF THE PROJECT

DEVELOP TRAINING RESOURCES

Within the project, a training module will be created with reading materials. The training resources will be gathered as theoretical information on radicalism, its causes and overcoming strategies and peacebuilding.

TRAINING FOR CIVIC EDUCATION TEACHERS

4-day training course will be held for civic education teachers combined with two stages on radicalism and other project-related issues in Tbilisi, Shida Kartli and Adjara regions. The trainings will be conducted by selected lecturers in the region.

LESSONS FOR PUPILS

50 trained civic education teachers will provide lessons to their students to raise their awareness about radicalism, violent extremism and peaceful coexistence.

TRAINING COURSE FOR STUDENTS

50 students from the target regions of the project will attended training course where students will increase their awareness of radicalism and violent extremism prevention methods, as well as develop skills in advocacy, community activism, project and initiative implementation.

IMPLEMENTING PROJECT INITIATIVES

After the training, each student, teacher and student will jointly plan and implement projects / initiatives for peaceful coexistence. A total of 50 such activities will be implemented.
